Are dogs allowed to run loose?

No, the City of Byron has an ordinance prohibiting dogs from running loose. If a stray dog is found, please contact the Ogle County Sheriff's Office/Byron Police Department at 815-732-2136.

Do I need a solicitor's permit to solicit in the City of Byron?

Yes, a permit is required and can be obtained at City Hall during normal business hours. The fee for a permit is \$100 per person for the first 5 days & \$25 per day each day thereafter. Applicants must supply a fingerprint background check and a copy of a \$1,000 surety bond.

For 17 years of age:

Sunday -Thursday: 12:00amFriday-Saturday: 1:00am

What is the driving curfew in Illinois (otherwise known as Graduated Driver's License Restrictions)?

For 16 & 17 year-olds:

Sunday-Thursday: 10:00pm-6:00amFriday & Saturday: 11:00pm-6:00am

When can I burn my yard waste?

Yard waste burning is allowed April 15 - May 31, and October 15 - November 30, from 6am-6pm
